ARREN Way says Yeovil lived the dream against United, Manchester despite crashing out of the FA Cup at Huish Park.

There are 86 league places between the two teams and it showed as goals from Marcus Rashford, Ander Herrera, Jesse Lingard and Romelu Lukaku comfortably saw Jose Mourinho's men book their place in the fifth round.

Yeovil started well and Jordan Green came close to opening the scoring inside seven minutes but his goalbound effort was blocked by the legs of goalkeeper Sergio Romero.

chance came on 24 minutes as new signing Alexis Sanchez fed Scott McTominay. The 21-year-old did everything right but Glovers goal-Artur keeper Krysiak read it well to keep the scores level.

United made the breakthrough four before minutes half-time as some indecisive Yeovil defending saw Tom James inex-plicably lose the ball to Rashford, who fired past the helpless Krysiak.

The home side searched for an equaliser but were

always vulnerable as they pushed more players forward.

Just past the hour United broke four-on-four, with Herrera finishing smartly to complete a devastating counter-attack.

In the closing minutes Lingard burst past the Yeovil defence to net a third and there was still time for Lukaku to fire home with the last kick of the game.
