TO GO WITH FASTEST HAT-TRICK RECORD

**JAMES HAYTER** wants to complete a hat-trick of play-off final wins to go with his record for the fastest ever Football League treble.

Hotshot Hayter, 34, made history by scoring three times in just **140 SECONDS** in Bournemouth's 6-0 win over Wrexham in 2004.

The striker also helped the Cherries to victory over Lincoln in the 2003 League Two play-off final before scoring the winner for Doncaster against Leeds in the League One final in 2008.
