 PUTS JOHNSON'S
 CUT-PRICE HEROES
 IN CHAMPIONSHIP**

GARY JOHNSON hailed his "bargain of the century" for netting little old Yeovil a £4million Championship prize.

Paddy Madden - a £20,000 October buy from Carlisle - lit up Wembley with a super goal. And it helped the Glovers to victory over Brentford as they carved themselves another slice of football history.

Centre-back Dan Burn added a second before half-time.

And although Harlee Dean pulled a goal back, it was not enough to save the Bees from crashing to a SEVENTH play-off failure.

The Somerset minnows, with a £1m player budget, will now be plying their trade in the second tier for the first time in their history.

Johnson - who took Yeovil from the Conference to League One in his first stint from 2001 to 2005, before returning last year to continue the job - acclaimed his Paddy Power.

He said: "Paddy must be the bargain of the century. He couldn't

get a game at Carlisle and is now a Golden Boot and League One promotion winner.

"His goal was one to grace Wembley - it was ingenuinity the way he bent it round the keeper.

"This is a fantastic achievement for Yeovil. We are a relatively small club with a small budget.

Rise

"I might have to ask for a whip-round to pay for the Championship," Madden said. "That was the best goal of my career. I started the season in the Carlisle stands and now I'm heading for the Championship."

Half of Yeovil's 40,000 population

travelled to London for the further rise of a club that took 108 years to reach the Football League in 2003.

And miracle-man Johnson - a Championship final play-off loser with Bristol City in 2008 - was soon leaping for joy when Madden scored after just six minutes.

The striker took a rebound in his stride and guided the ball past keeper Simon Moore for his 24th goal of the campaign.

Then, three minutes before the break, Burn rose highest to meet Ed Upson's corner and head his side into a two-goal lead.

The Bees came out buzzing after the break and Dean reduced the

MANAGER

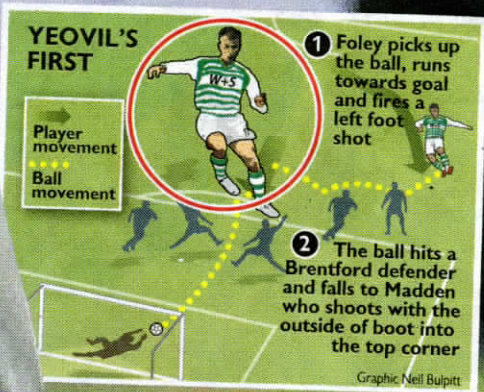
IF anyone can keep Yeovil up it is Johnson, who has taken them from the Conference to the Championship.

arrears on 51 minutes when he headed in an Adam Forshaw corner.

Brentford - who were denied automatic promotion by Doncaster with the last kick of the season - threw everything at the Glovers.

Yeovil stopper Marek Stech did well to save Clayton Donaldson's header and threw himself full-length to claw away substitute Bradley Wright-Phillips' volley.

Bees chief Uwe Rosler said: "Congratulations to Gary and his team because they have done incredibly well on limited resources."

Stronger

"My team were fantastic in the second half and really went for it but we couldn't get the second goal.

"But this result doesn't kill you - it only makes you stronger."

Johnson added: "Now I hope to get that bust the chairman promised me 10 years ago when I took the club into the Football League.

"Winston Churchill got one for doing less than me! It won't cost much - I'm not a big man."
