"It is part of our policy to get all resident players. It is not a satisfactory arrangement to have players living away and it is difficult to build up an effective team policy in such circumstances. In future we shall not entertain the idea of signing any new players unless they can reside here. We have tried to buy houses for those players we have signed who live away, but it is impossible.

"We shall endeavour to obtain players with no home ties because it is easier to obtain accommodation for them. Married players will have to reside here, but we shall not be able to guarantee them a house. If married players come, they will have to find their own accommodation. In any case they will have to live locally."
