Moran makes life harder for Yeovil

THEY had to close the gates at Huish Park last night as the race to reach the Vauxhall Conference gath-

But with honours even after a mighty tussle, the two ICIS League pace-setters will have to wait a while before the issue as to which of them returns to a higher level is resolved.

Yeovil could hardly have wished for a better start in front of the 8,007 crowd, the best in non-League football this season. Two goals up inside six minutes and apparently coasting, they were then hit, however, by an Enfield recovery sparked by the first of two goals from Paul Moran.

The first Yeovil goal came after three minutes. With his last contri-bution before being carried off, left-back Micky Engwell accepted Paul

Turner's pass to float over a ball that was neither cross nor shot but still nestled just inside the far upright. When Andy Pape then went full length to turn aside Howard Forin-ton's drive, Turner was first to the loose ball to double Yeovil's lead.

Their glee was short-lived. Fol-lowing a mad scramble in which Graham Roberts cleared off the line, Moran scored with a low shot through a forest of legs. His second goal, from the penalty spot, came in the 38th minute after Rob Cousins had tripped Lee Endersby.
